Shelby Fire & Rescue News

The newly reorganized Shelby Fire & Rescue Department has been extremely busy during its first month of operation. The process of inducting 20 plus new members has been a monumental task. Medical exams, drug tests, CPR training, driver training and driver certification are just a few of the many items that were completed. Several members have sacrificed much of their free time in order to bring the department up to a status where once again we are able to serve the community. Some volunteers have gone above and beyond when they chose to set aside their paid positions so that they could dedicate their time to tasks such as cleaning the protective turn-out gear, inspecting and repairing breathing apparatus or arranging for the repair of equipment. In order to insure the reliability of the department and the safety of its personnel, recognizing defective equipment and having it repaired or replaced immediately has been a high priority. With that being said, the members of the Shelby Volunteer Fire & Rescue Department are in the planning process to purchase a new firefighting pumper apparatus to replace its 1989 FTI Hercules Pumper Fire Truck. The need to purchase a new pumper is critical and has become the department's number one priority.

The department is working on a preliminary design of a new fire truck pumper. The functional design of the new pumper will be centered on the needs of a small rural department.

The department has set a goal to provide the City of Shelby with a final approved contract for apparatus construction by July 1, 2015. The estimated timeframe for construction is approximately one year.

We are looking forward to a great year in the department and if anyone has interest in joining or helping the department they can contact Chief Kroll, a current fire dept. member or Shelby City Hall or any member of the city council for more information.

We also wanted everyone to be aware that all donations and fundraising dollars always have and still will go entirely towards the FD. Any specific gifts or donations should be noted so they can be applied towards that individuals wishes.
