Junk or Abandoned Vehicles

The city shall serve notice to any person with junked or abandoned vehicle, as described in City Ordinance , Chapter 10. The city may also remove any vehicle left parked on a street or public alley for a continuous period of 72 hrs or more. Any questions should be directed to the Shelby City Council

3-10-8 JUNK VEHICLES DECLARED A NUISANCE. Except as hereinafter provided, it is hereby declared that the parking, leaving, or storage of a junk vehicle upon either public or private property within the corporate limits of the City of Shelby, Iowa, constitutes a threat to the health and safety of the citizens and is a nuisance within the meaning of Section 657.1 of the Code of Iowa. If any junk vehicle is stored upon private property or public property in violation thereof, the owner of the property shall be liable for said violation.

Shelby Fire & Rescue News

2015 was a transition year for our department and I am happy to report that it was a successful year. Once unfamiliar faces are now family and this family have truly embraced the meaning of teamwork, “Trust, openness and cooperation”.

The department has 25 members. 16 members are certified as Firefighter I and six are certified as Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT). In addition, there are three EMT’s in training. Last year our volunteers responded to 110 fire and rescue calls, which does not include the calls for welfare checks and storm spotting. It is imperative that the fire and rescue department has a reliable fleet vehicle apparatus. The need to purchase a new pumper was critical; therefore, it became the department’s number one priority of replacement. After a joint collaboration between department members, equipment vendors and the Shelby City Council, a contract to have the truck built was in place by mid-summer of 2015. Delivery of the apparatus is estimated to be July of 2016 and the public is encouraged to come and view the new truck.

The need for volunteers is ongoing. Being a volunteer is an extremely rewarding experience. In addition, members are paid for their response of each call and their pay is based on their level of expertise. Requirements to become a member include a medical exam, drug test and a background check. The aforementioned requirements are paid for by the City of Shelby. Successful candidates are required to receive driver training/certification and CPR training/certification. Within one year it is required that the candidate become trained and certified as a Firefighter I or become an EMT with minor training in Firefighter I.
